### Our Central Principles

- It is best for children to maintain a good relationship with both parents after separation, unless there are *good reasons* why this should not be the case.
- Any parent who disrupts this relationship, without good reason, should be immediately regarded as a 'suspect' parent – *why* are they doing something that is bad for their children?
- Family law should be organised around *protecting and preserving* these parent-child relationships, not around merely *administering* their disruption.

### Our Main Aims

- To peacefully campaign and build on the public awareness already created by other parenting campaign groups through the use of simple arguments
- To make the public aware that the current system is not just imperfect — it is *bad* for children.
- To publicise the unjust nature of the current family law system and demonstrate the issues are not just *fathers' rights*, but children's lives, the lives of both their parents, their extended families and society at large — who all have something to gain from a well managed system; and are currently losing out from an inadequate and failing system
- To work in parallel and in co-operation with all other groups dedicated to family law reform
